- 1820 [s: tailors beginning to make mens clothing that was ready made, as well as custom-made clothing
- 1820s: machine -loom factories in Paisley opened to produce Indian cone patterned shawls rom Kashmir and were named after the Scottish town where were crafted
- 1820s-1840s: mass production of lace on textile equipment
